



# CHIGWELL GOLF CLUB

## DRESS CODE

If it is your intention to use any of the facilities of the club you should ensure that you (and your guests) are suitably dressed in smart, clean clothing and comply with all aspects of the dress code. This includes your arrival and departure from the clubhouse and car park. Clothing or footwear must not be changed in the car park. It is however permitted to put wet weather clothing on at your car. Weather-protective clothing should be specifically designed for golf.

### AT THE CLUB, ON THE COURSE AND IN THE SPIKE BAR

Gentlemen and boys must wear socks at all times:

Denim jeans and any other items made of denim material of any colour, football shirts or shirts/jumpers with large numbers, letters or logos on the back or front, tracksuits, or trainers are not permitted to be worn anywhere within the Club. Caps, hats and visors may not be worn at any time in the Spike Bar, Lounge Bar or Dining Room.

#### **Gentlemen and Boys:**

- Long sleeve, short-sleeve shirts/polo shirts with collars are all permitted and should be tucked into trousers. Sleeveless shirts and shirts without collars are not permitted, with the exception of turtleneck shirts specifically designed for golf.
- Shorts must be tailored and knee length and worn only with knee length socks or plain white short golf socks supplied through the Professional's Shop incorporating the Chigwell logo. Alternatively, plain white or white golf socks with a logo from another golf club may be worn.
- Combat style trousers or shorts with external side pockets are not allowed.
- Sandals are not permitted.

#### **Ladies and Girls:**

- Long-sleeve, short-sleeve, and sleeveless shirts/polo shirts with collars are all permitted and should be tucked in to trousers/shorts/skirts unless they are specifically tailored to be worn outside.
- Sun tops and shirts without collars are not permitted, with the exception of turtleneck shirts specifically designed for golf.
- Skirts/skorts/shorts and other tailored trousers specifically designed for golf are permitted
- Combat style trousers or shorts with external side pockets are not allowed.

### IN THE LOUNGE BAR & DINING ROOM

The Lounge Bar and Dining Room should not be treated as an extension of the Spike Bar. Accordingly, clothes in which members have played golf may not necessarily be suitable attire especially in winter months; weather-protective clothing may not be worn at any time. Gentlemen are not permitted to wear shorts unless special dispensation has been given.

#### **Monday to Saturday after 6.30pm**

- Gentlemen and boys over 16 should wear a jacket, collared shirt and tie unless dispensation is given.
- Ladies, girls and boys under 16 must wear smart casual wear.

#### **Sundays Lounge Bar**

- Gentlemen and boys over 16 may wear smart casual wear and/or a collared shirt. T-shirts are not allowed.
- Ladies and girls and boys under 16 must wear smart casual wear.

#### **Sundays Dining Room until 2.30**

- Gentlemen and boys over 16 must wear a jacket and collared shirt; polo shirts and T-shirts are not allowed.
- Ladies and girls and boys under 16 must wear smart casual wear.
- After 2.30 the dress code for the Lounge Bar will apply in the dining room

Disregard for these standards may lead to the person or persons concerned being asked to leave the course or Clubhouse by the Club Secretary or any Club Official.

### MOBILE PHONES

Mobile phones may not be used on the golf course with the exception of a medical emergency. Calls may not be made or received in the clubhouse and phones should be maintained on "silent or vibrate" mode at all times. Calls made or taken outside the clubhouse must occur with consideration for others.
